

Economic impact to the Mornington Peninsula Region

PHS is a unique Australian spa and hot spring ecotourism attraction located on the Mornington Peninsula in Victoria. Operating since 2005, PHS provides therapeutic treatments, wellness services and larger bathing attraction to cater for all ages.

PHS is visited by approximately 440,000 quests annually to attend one, or both, of PHS' main areas – the Bath House and Spa Dreaming Centre. The Bath House, more social and family friendly, attracts approximately 365,000 guests each year who can freely bath in a variety of hot springs, pools and saunas. The Spa Dreaming Centre, a tranquil space with private pools and spa treatment, attracts approximately 75,000 quest annually and seeks to provide a unique relaxation and rejuvenation experience.

EY has been engaged by Peninsula Hot Springs Pty Ltd to estimate the annual economic impact to the Mornington Peninsula Region (the 'Region') from visitation to Peninsula Hot Springs (PHS). For the purpose of this assessment the economic impact is based on activities during FY17 (July 2016 to June 2017). We have also provided a high level estimate of the total Net Present Value (NPV) of the annual economic impact over an assumed 20 year period (FY17 to FY36)1.

The economic impact estimates in this report relate directly to the increase in expenditure generated by visitors to the Morning Peninsula Region (MPR) that come to the Region specifically, or extend their stay, because of PHS.


These are the poorest people in the world and include nearly 1 billion people without access to sufficient drinking water or food, and 2.4 billion people who lack


